Tour Emphasizes Jobs At Beaumont Hospital

High school principals and counselors from Seaboard, Groves, Marian and Brother Rice toured the William Beaumont Hospital in Royal Oak Monday night to learn about job opportunities in the hospital field for young people.

Visiting the medical records library, where 50,000 records on patients' care are stored, they were told there is a shortage of properly trained women for these well-paying careers.

In the physical therapy room, the fact was stressed that a great need exists for professionals to help patients on the road to rehabilitation.

JOB OPPORTUNITIES for women as registered nurses and practical nurses were discussed when the tour arrived at the nursing office.

Emphasis was made of jobs now available for men as technicians such as in the X-ray rooms, and new opportunities for them with increasing use of electronic equipment in jobs formerly performed by women workers.

Dinner and more details from hospital directors followed the tour, in the doctors' dining room.

THE COUNSELORS were asked to provide Beaumont with names of students who expressed interest and ability in various lines of hospital work.

Tours, for after school or on

Saturday, would be arranged and enable pupils to meet with hospital directors in their individual area of interest.

Beaumont, the principals and counselors learned, has some 125 different kinds of hospital jobs available, which can be boiled down to 60 classifications.

In addition to jobs already mentioned, these include nurses aides, floor secretaries, dietitians, stock and receiving clerks, multilingual operators and pharmacists.

Doctors, of course, are needed.

OTHER WORKERS hired by Beaumont Hospital include housekeeping employees, maintenance men such as cabinetmakers, electricians and plumbers, and laundry workers.

Beaumont Hospital proposed the tour partly from a "selfish" motive for it has already drawn upon a major share of trained people in the local community to fill its specialized jobs.

But a planned expansion, to increase patient care from 250 beds to 700 within the next two years, will call for a necessarily large increase in staff personnel.

for these expenses is made in the assessment.

Generally the commissioners felt that it was hard to compare public and private parking lots. It was noted that when the municipal lots were constructed benefiting adjacent property owners were assessed 40 per cent of the cost. The remaining 60 per cent was charged against the Auto Parking System.

CITY MANAGER L. R. Gare said on several occasions the administration have been approached by property owners outside the central business district in regard to the city constructing parking lots through the Auto Parking System.

"When it was explained to them that if the city were financially able and did participate in a municipal parking lot, provision would have to be made to charge for the use of the lot by meters or otherwise," Gare said.

He noted that in almost every case the property owners lost interest because they preferred free parking for their customers.

THE ONE EXCEPTION Gare said was Lot No. 6 on North Woodward Avenue back of the Reid Building near Harmon.

In this particular area, Gare said, the property owners had been unable to acquire the necessary property for a parking lot and they requested the city to acquire the land and construct the lot.

"In this particular case the property owners paid 92 1/2 per cent of the cost," Gare said. He further pointed out that meters were completely installed in the street and the access drive in front of the area involved as well as in a portion of the lot itself.

Commissioner said they could see the association's problem but felt the group should work through the board of review which is currently in session.

Lathrup Council Opposes I-696 Routing on 11 Mile

LATHRUP—The council Monday went on record as opposed to the routing of highway I-696 through the city on 11 Mile Road. It also authorized the city engineers, Ayres, Lewis, Norris and May, to submit a plan for water system improvements to the state health department.

Although City Attorney Everett

Hayes was unable to report whether the executors for the estate of Louise Lathrup Kelley will continue to fight a suit—brought by her and her husband shortly before her death in January—the council decided to show opposition to the use of the road for a highway.

MRS. KELLEY and her husband brought the suit to vacate 96 feet of right-of-way on either side of 11 Mile. If the suit is decided for the Kelley estate and Mr. Kelley, it could keep the east-west expressway off of 11 Mile Road but will reduce the strip to a width of 106

feet. Nevertheless, the city had decided to intervene in the suit in action taken in December.

The resolution Monday was based on contentions that the highway would destroy a feeder route through the city and decrease the value of land along 11 Mile Road.

Plenty of land is available at 10 1/2 Mile Road or south, the resolution said, and it is more logical to use this area for a corridor.

THE PLAN to eliminate six dead-end streets in the city and to check all valves and hydrants in the system will be submitted by the engineers while City Administrator Gerald Stone checks to see if federal aid is

available. Application has already been made. Total cost was estimated earlier at about \$24,800.

Ray Smit, representing ALN&M, said storm sewer construction was about three-fourths done and that the spring thaws would enable the contractor to finish the work and cleanup that is necessary.

Sanitary interceptor capacity to the Evergreen is sufficient, Smit said, so that the city will have no problem as its population grows.
