It is also a pleasure to see her name appear so often as a winner at these tournaments. I decided to follow this through and see her success. I found that Sybil Robinson plays sound bridge and has all the qualities of a top bridge player.

Sybil (South) was fortunate in that although her partner had a hand with no high card points, it provided her with the necessary distribution not only to make her double contract, but two over tricks. Both vulnerable. Dealer: East.

Sybil felt she had too strong a hand to make a mere over-call of two hearts and decided to double. West wanted to provide his partner with an additional suit if he had started with a four card major, but it may be said that Sybil's bid of three hearts was daring.

In the play of the hand, it became a complete cross-ruff and two over tricks could not be avoided. Had West led a trump, the hand could have been held to one over-trick.

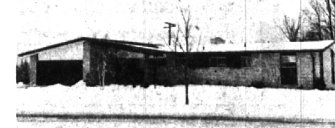
