

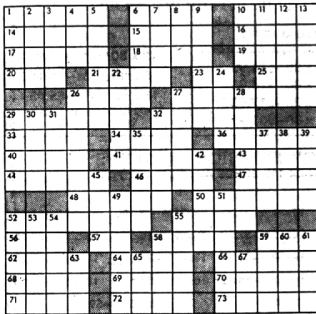

Spina Will Show, Comment Upon Photos of Pope

Color photographs of the coronation of Pope John XXIII and the opening of the Ecumenical Council, two of the more spectacular religious events in modern times, will be shown at a meeting of the Women of St. Owens in the parish auditorium, Franklin Road near Maple Road, at 9 p.m. Wednesday. The Reverend Edward Walling, pastor of St. Owens, said all members of the parish were invited to attend.

The photographs to be shown are transparencies made by newspaper photographer Tony Spina. Spina will describe the events portrayed in his photographic record. He will also show a number of camera studies he made of Pope John a short time after he was elevated to office.

Spina was given permission to picture His Holiness as he sat for Giacomo Manzoni, the noted sculptor. The experience gave Spina an opportunity to establish a personal acquaintance with the Holy Father and his commentary will include observations he made of the personality and character of the leader of Roman Catholicism.

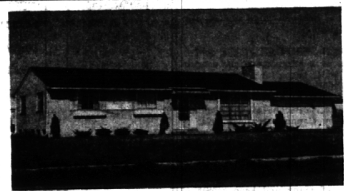

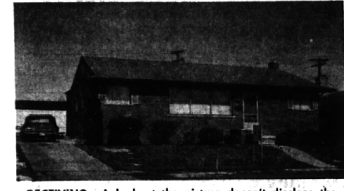
