## New Continuing Education Courses Offered in B'ham

Several new courses will be offered during the spring term of the continuing (adult) education program of Birmingham Public Schools. Most of the classes will meet from 8 to 10 p.m., once a week for eight weeks, unless otherwise noted on the course list. Classes will begin April 8.

A new course, "Law for the Small Businessman," is designed to help the businessman to improve his business and to increase his profits through a better understanding of the law. The course will be a series of lectures and discussion under the direction of Robert H. Golden, attorney.

Golden will also teach "You and Your Estate," a practical approach to estate planning for the family.

OTHER NEW courses will include "Puppetry" in which students will make a variety of puppets and marionettes.

A course in "Rug Hooking" will be offered. Students will learn the techniques of hooking, color harmony and planning, rug binding and pattern development.

Because of the popularity of the "Connoisseur's Kitchen," a second class will be offered.

"The Psychology of Human Relations" will be offered in cooperation with Wayne State University, under the direction of Dr. Michael Schwartz, an assistant professor. The purpose of the course will be to consider the problems and processes of human relations. Emphasis will be on how we see and affect each other in everyday interactions in various social situations—at home, at work, at parties and on the street.

This informal group is made up mostly of professional men and women who have a common interest of relaxing by gardening in a greenhouse during the winter months. 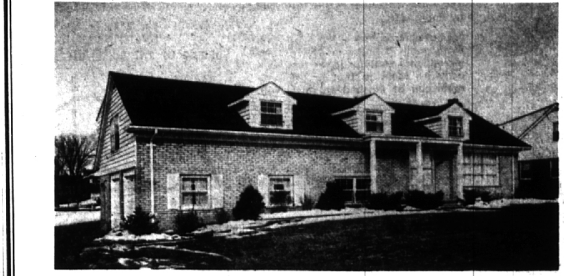
