## B'field Board Upholds Zone Recommendations

BLOOMFIELD TOWNSHIP—Appeals from two recent rezoning decisions of the township planning commission were made before the township board at its meeting Monday night.

In both cases, the board unanimously upheld the planning commission's recommendation to deny the petitions.

Further board action authorized township attorney Tom Dillon to defend the township in a lawsuit brought following an earlier refusal by the board to rezone Big Beaver frontage.

PROPERTIES INVOLVED in the first appeal front on Long Lake and Telegraph roads immediately adjacent to the southeast corner of the intersection. Property owners requested rezoning from local to general business in order to build a Holiday Inn Motel on the Telegraph frontage.

Board member Robert Reid, who is also a member of the planning commission, told owners that the request was denied in order to properly plan for an orderly development of the commercial frontage on both roads.

Reid said township officials plan to meet with all the owners of property fronting on Long Lake or Telegraph in the immediate vicinity of the intersection to work out

a development plan in keeping with township zoning principles.

THE SECOND PETITION denied involved 25 acres on the northwest corner of Telegraph and 14 Mile roads.

The request was for rezoning from single residence to multiple housing. Owner's plans were to erect 72 apartments to rent from \$175 to \$285 per month.

Denial was based on the township concept that multiple housing be used as a transitional zone between commercial and residential property. All property immediately adjacent to the 25 acres is zoned residential.

TOWNSHIP zoning of the Brown-Larsen property fronting on Big Beaver just east of Gleaner Building is being contested by owners of the property in Oakland County Circuit Court.

The property is presently zoned in the highest restricted residential classification, R-3. Late last year, the township board upheld the planning commission and denied a request to rezone it for a multiple housing development.

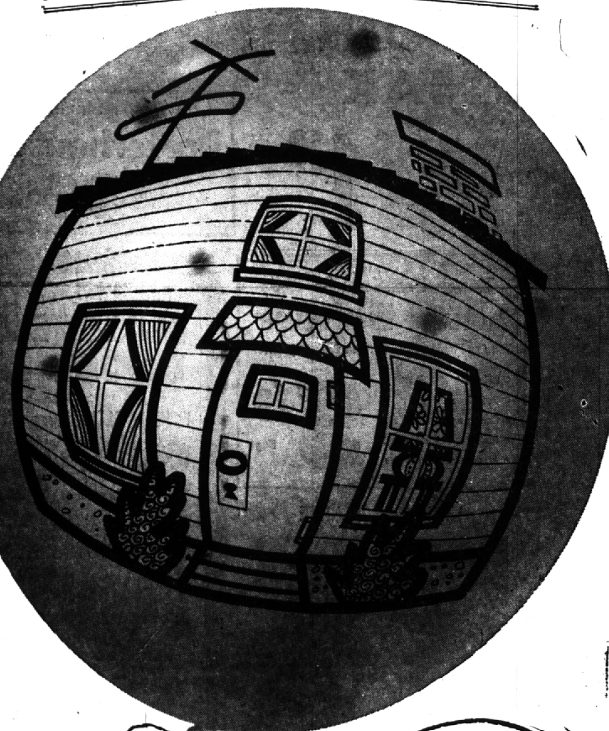
