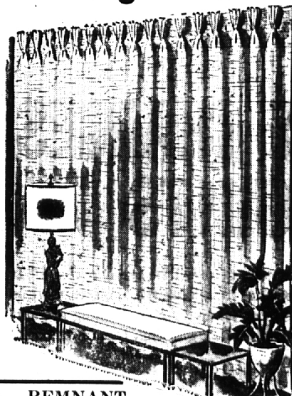

McPartlin Appointed Brigadier

James H. McPartlin, formerly of Birmingham, has been appointed as a brigadier general in the Air Force Reserve by President Kennedy.

Gen. McPartlin is commander of the 42nd Troop Carrier Wing (Reserve) at Richards-Gebaur Air Force Base near Kansas City, Mo. Prior to assuming command of the 42nd, he was reserve commander of the 404th Troop Carrier Wing, Selfridge Air Force Base, Mich.

Gen. McPartlin's military career began with the Michigan National Guard in 1935, shortly after his graduation from the Pontiac High School. In July, 1941, he enlisted as an aviation cadet and the following February received his commission at Victoria, Texas.

Going to England in early 1942 with the 91st Bomb Group, he flew 35 combat missions with the 401st Bomb Squadron. From September 1943 to September 1944 he was commander of this squadron.

HE WAS GRADUATED from the Command and General Staff School at Fort Leavenworth, Kan., in 1945, and released from active duty in December, 1946.

He is a past commander of the Norman Lyle Squadron of the Air Force Association. Gen. and Mrs. McPartlin, the former Virginia Mae Saunders of Detroit, and their daughter and four sons make their home in Overland Park, Kan.
