Little Leaguers Will Register in S'field Saturday

Southfield Little League's once-a-year registration will be held Saturday, at Southfield High School gym. All boys who expect to take part in this year's program must register.

National League boys will register from 9 a.m. to 1 noon and boys for the American League will register from 1:30 to 4 p.m. Each boy must present his birth certificate and pay a fee, which will cover both registration and a physical exam to be given Saturday. In addition, a boy must present two registration cards, both signed by his parents.

THE PROGRAM is open to boys 8-12 years of age. League ages are determined by the following schedule: 12 year olds are boys born from Aug. 1, 1950 to July 31, 1951; 11 year olds are boys born from Aug. 1, 1951 to July 31, 1952; 10 year olds are boys born from Aug. 1, 1952 to July 31, 1953; 9 year olds are boys born from Aug. 1, 1953 to July 31, 1954; 8 year olds are boys born from Aug. 1, 1954 to July 31, 1955.

Tryouts for the league are scheduled for April 13, 20 and 27, 1963 and times of tryouts will be announced shortly. The league season will begin in early May.

B'ham Helps Detroit Win Olympic Bid

Birmingham-area people contributed greatly to the success of the Detroit presentation at Olympic House, New York, which won for Detroit the choice of the U. S. Olympic Committee as the site of the 1968 Games, officials said today.

"To show you a Detroit you've never met" the Detroit Olympic Committee demonstrated by means of motion pictures and slides that Detroit merited the distinction and is fully prepared to be host city to the classic of international sports. Chairman of the presentation planning committee was Fred Mattheasi, Jr., of 876 Covington Road, Birmingham, with Thomas B. Adams, president of Campbell, Ewald Co., 931 W. Haradale, Bloomfield Hills, heading up the effort on the presentation itself.

THOSE ACTIVE in the production of the presentation included Phil Mason, of 1133 Wakefield, Birmingham, of MacManus, John & Adams, Inc., and Everett Schaffer, of 608 Safford, Birmingham, senior vice president of The Jam Handy Organization, which produced the two motion picture observers said did much to swing the majority of the U. S. Olympic Committee toward approval of Detroit's bid.

Leading off the presentation was Frederick C. Mattheasi, Sr., who has been campaigning to bring the Games to Detroit for 26 years. Los Angeles, the chief contender against Detroit, received four votes to Detroit's 33 after each city had made its hour-long presentation. Final decision on the site for the 1968 games will be made in Nairobi by the International Olympic Committee.

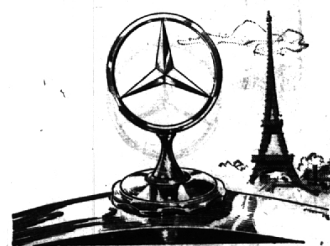
