#### 2 Newcomers Win Seats in B'field Hills

In one of the most spirited contests in recent years, almost 70 per cent of Bloomfield Hills' registered yoters went to the polls Monday and elected two new members to the city commission.

Two incumbents, Mayor John S. Bugas and Robert A. Frye, were defeated in bids for re-election to two-year terms. Lyman J. Craig, the other incumbent, won another. The new commissioners are David, W. Lee, manager of Ford's truck advertising and a former president of the Hills' School Board, who polled 611 votes; and attorney Louis J. Colombo, Jr., with 559 votes.







### Library Proposal Passes in B'field
