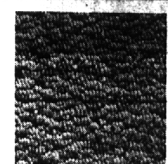

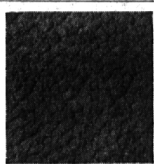

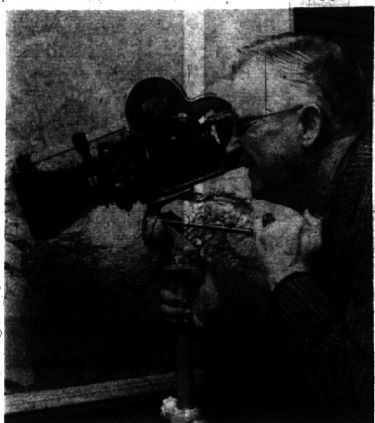

Burma Visitor To Be Feted At Dinner Party

The John Bekolays c/o Forestbrook, Beverly Hills, are entertain-
ing distinguished guest, the Most Rev. Ferdinand Guer-
cilena, Bishop of Kengtung, E.S. Burma, at a dinner Monday evening. His Excellency has just arrived from Rome, where he attended the Ecumenical Council, and is spending a month in the United States. Included among the dinner guests are Birminghamites Mr. and Mrs. William Densen, Mr. and Mrs. Dorne Dible, Mr. and Mrs. Nick Kewhaw and Mr. and Mrs. V. Reo Campian.

His Excellency refers to himself as "The Bishop of the Jungle" because his diocese is Kengtung, Burma, one of the most remote sections in the world. Kengtung is a mountainous, tropical area about the size of Michigan but with few motorable roads. Although he has been a Bishop only since 1950, His Excellency has lived among the primitive people in this region for nearly 37 years.

The son of a family of fishermen until he was 16, the Bishop was a Sergeant in World War I before he became a priest. The 63 year old prelate is in the United States as the guest of the Foster Parents Mission Club which is helping his orphanage in Burma. He is traveling to various cities giving lectures and visiting "Parents" of his children.
