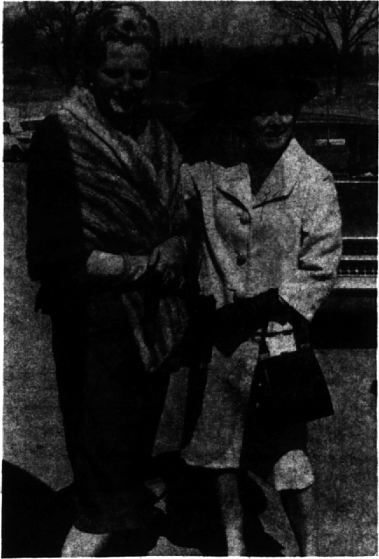


Forest Lake Members Greet Spring Head On!

Seven Colleges Set For Annual Diive

Arnold Toynbee, world-famous historian, will speak at Ford Auditorium at 8:30 p.m. Wednesday, May 1. Mr. Toynbee will be the guest of the Detroit Committee for Seven Eastern Women's Colleges, which annually brings to Detroit a prominent speaker as a highlight of their fund-raising drive for Detroit-area scholarships at seven major eastern colleges for women.

The committee represents nearly 2,000 alumnae in this area from Barnard, Bryn Mawr, Mount Holyoke, Radcliffe, Smith, Vas-

sar and Wellesley who, besides raising funds for scholarships, spread the word on the advantages of liberal arts education. Mrs. John S. Judd of Birmingham is general chairman of the committee, and Mrs. H. Paul Sloan is project chairman.

The subject of Mr. Toynbee's speech will be "An Historian Looks at the World Today". Mr. Toynbee is best known for his monumental work, "A Study of History", comprised of 12 volumes. However, he became a best-selling author with the general public with the abridgement by D. C. Somervell of "A Study of History". It was on the best-seller list for many weeks, and also was a Book-of-the-Month Club selection. In addition, Mr. Toynbee has lectured extensively at leading universities around the world, and has made numerous appearances on television and radio.
