## Choir Gives High School Assemblies

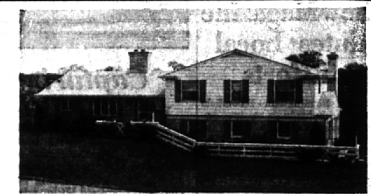

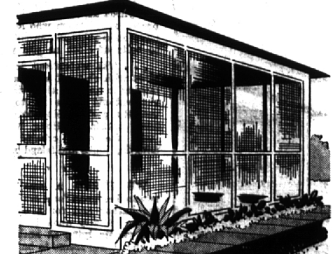
