

Opera Workshop Series Begins at End of Month

An opera fan is an insatiable mingham-Bloomfield committee of opera fan, and to what a few more of the Detroit Grand Opera Association is sponsoring a workshop at "Met" to Detroit in May the Baldwin Library beginning April 29.

The workshop series will consist of six listening-lecture sessions in which operas to be performed by the "Met" will be studied. Each meeting will last one and one-half hours.

Pre-registration for the series is required and may be made at Grinnell's Monday through Friday until April 26 beginning Monday. There is a charge for each session to aid the library in purchasing opera recordings.

LEADING OFF with "Tosca" at 9:30 a.m. April 29 will be Mrs. Robert G. Leggett of Royal Oak. Following at 9:30 a.m. the next day with "La Traviata" will be Lloyd Murphy of the Birmingham Conservatory of Music.

A "first"—an evening session—on "Otello" will be held at 8:15 p.m. April 30, led by Marius Fossenkemper of the Detroit Conservatory of Music and Marygrove College.

THE CLOSING three lecture-recitals will be held at 9:30 a.m. May 1 when Miss Bertha Seifert, head of the music department at Kingswood School, will consider "Die Meistersinger von Nuernberg"; at 9:30 a.m. May 2 when James Rosenthal, a music teacher in the Pontiac school system, will discuss "Pagliacci" and "Cavalleria Rusticana"; and at 9:30 a.m. May 3 when Walter Schmitt of the Birmingham Conservatory of Music will cover "Boris Godunov."

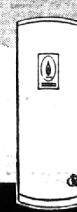
