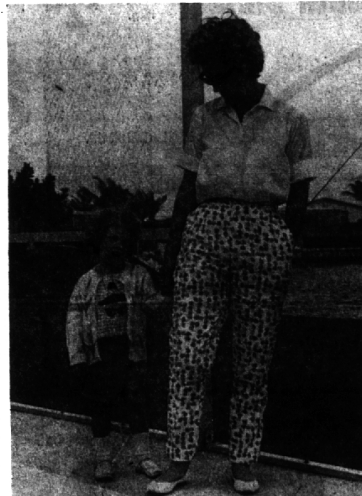
RETURN

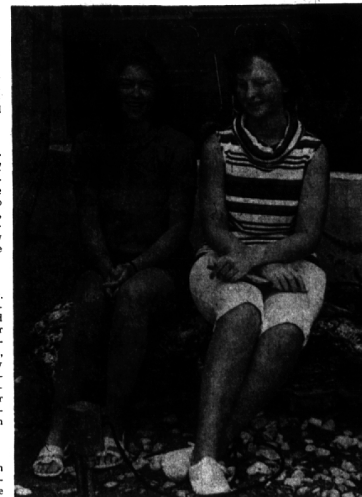
PARTICIPANT

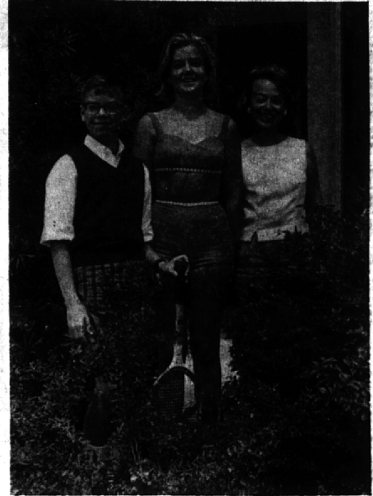
