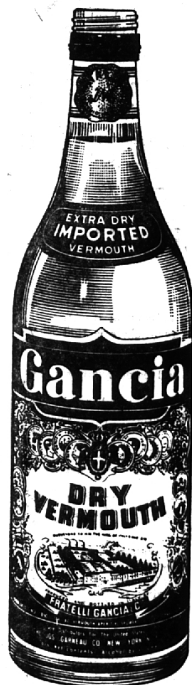

Seaholm Seniors Tour Washington, Broadway

Over 270 seniors from Seaholm and Groves left Detroit April 11 to start one of the biggest events of the senior year—the Washington trip. Aboard a special nine-car train, the students arrived in Washington, D. C. by 8:30 the next morning.

Besides Washington, the students also toured Williamsburg, Va., and New York City, where they saw the Broadway hit show, "A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum." The trip ends Friday, April 19, when students return to Detroit.

There was much planning and preparation to insure an enjoyable trip. Eugene Hubbard, director of the annual trip, and his assistant, began working in the fall.

AS SECRETARY, Kathy Riley handled the tremendous amount of typing that was necessary. Committees were appointed to handle the two events which took place in Hotel Chamberlin, Va., the Easter sunrise service and the variety show. Other important people concerned with the Washington trip were its president, John Weston, and Bob Williams, who was in charge of producing the souvenir booklet, "Capitol Bound." Members of the steering committee of BUNA have selected 24 delegates from the club's recent general assembly to attend the United Nations (commonly re-

ferred to as MUN) at the University of Detroit. MUN conducts an assembly similar to that held at Seaholm which will be held this year on April 26-28.

Over 550 students from the Detroit area will participate in MUN this year as each of the 110 countries in the United Nations will be represented by a five-man delegation.

BUNA was requested to fill the delegations of five nations—Malagasy, Lebanon, United Kingdom, Rumania and Columbia. Students were selected for these delegations on the basis of their performance in BUNA over the past year, especially at the general assembly.

Those chosen to represent Malagasy are Chuck Holts (chairman), Pat Squibb, Erin Newhouse, Don Palmer and Ed Waller. Art Hefflinger (chairman), Bill Seipp, Carol Vander Root, Jere Stone and Patt Wyatt will form the delegation from Lebanon.

Rumania's delegation will consist of Chuck Bethel (chairman), Linda Kerley, Bob Swanson, Dianne Harrington and Sue Gargill. Composing the Columbia delegation are Dave Sanders (chairman), Scott Woodson, Bill Beeske and Sarah Bailey.

The United Kingdom will be represented by Tom Brooks, Bob Brown, Stan Cutler, John McCullough and Ben Root. No chairman has been appointed yet.

THE MEMBERS of the Cleveland Heights, O., Choir spent an enjoyable evening with the members of Seaholm's choir on Sunday, April 7.

The Seaholm choir members volunteered to take as many into their homes as possible. As the Cleveland Heights choir was to put on a concert at Seaholm the next morning, William Seebach, SHS choir director, thought this idea would eliminate confusion.

The Cleveland Heights choir, was the first American high school choir to sing in Europe. This memorable event came in 1953, when 70 members of the choir raised \$75,000 to sing in France, Germany, Denmark, Sweden, Norway, Scotland and England.

Concert tours have taken the choir into 15 eastern states and three times into Canada.
