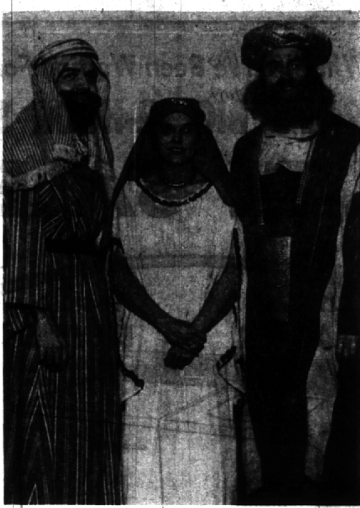

State Police Cars Roll Up 24 Million Miles

The Michigan State Police motor fleet, most of which are patrol cars, traveled 24,679,081 miles last year at an operating cost of only .0228 cents per mile.

Total operation costs and depreciation amounted to \$1,194,706. The department had 686 vehicles in service at the end of 1962.

The operating cost including high test gas needed for state police cars, oil, tires, tubes, repairs, servicing, license plates and insurance totaled \$704,542.

THE 686 OLD units sold during the year had an accumulated mileage of 21,998,210. These vehicles originally cost \$740,787 and were sold for \$260,513, making a net difference of \$480,274 for a depreciation cost of \$218 per mile.

Eddy Book Published in Paperback

A paperback edition will be published May 8 of one of the world's most widely circulated religious books—"Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" by Mary Baker Eddy.

This is the book that for nearly 70 years has been read along with the Bible at all Christian Science church services, in place of sermons by ministers. Christian Scientists turn to it regularly for explanation of the Bible and religious inspiration.

ALTHOUGH THIS will be the first paperback edition of "Science and Health," the book has already reached sales of several millions since it first appeared in 1875.

The new 700-page paperback, like all other editions of "Science and Health," will be published by the trustees under the will of Mary Baker Eddy, in Boston.

It will be distributed by Harper & Row, Inc., of New York, Evanston and London to bookstores and Christian Science Reading Rooms.
