## Troy Commission Approves Rezoning For Sears Center

The Troy Planning Commission last week approved a petition to rezone a 128-acre parcel on the northwest corner of John R and 14 Mile from light industrial to commercial, to allow for a construction of a re-

gional shopping center including a Sears, Roebuck store.

The shopping center will be 2½ times the size of Wonderland Shopping Center in Livonia. Six hundred permanent jobs will be created and 1,200 persons employed during the rush seasons.

A public hearing date on the rezoning will be set by the Planning Commission at its session Monday.

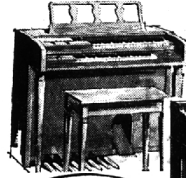

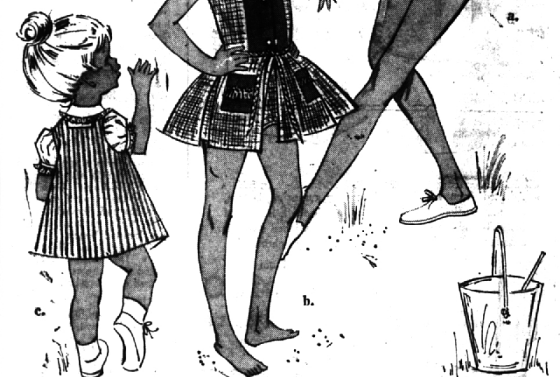

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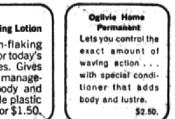
