

## Walter Hagen's Grandson Hurt In Gun Accident

The 14-year-old grandson of golfing great Walter Hagen remained in "very critical" condition at Pontiac General Hospital Wednesday following a shooting accident at his Union Lake Village home Tuesday night.

According to West Bloomfield police, Walter Hagen III was wounded in the head by a bullet fired from an automatic pistol by a friend, Michael A. Hough, also 14, of Union Lake Village.

POLICE SAID the two boys had been target shooting outside with Hagen's father's gun. The Hough youngster said he removed the clip before entering the house but did not realize there was a bullet in the chamber of the weapon.

Although police believe the shooting accidental, the Oakland County prosecutor was scheduled to take a statement from the Hough boy.

Hospital authorities said that Hagen had not regained consciousness.

"Special Warfare personnel will put in their first appearance in Detroit with a program featuring hand-to-hand combat.

## Motorists Set Record For Travel

Michigan motorists set new high-way travel records in January and February despite long periods of sub-zero temperatures during both months.

State Highway Commissioner John C. Mackie said traffic volume counts show an increase of nearly eight per cent in the number of vehicles on Michigan highways during the first two months compared to the same period a year ago.

Mackie said increased industrial activity was the major factor in the record traffic volumes. Heavy traffic on routes leading to winter sports centers also contributed to the big increase over a year ago.

MANY OF THE larger traffic gains were recorded on freeways indicating Michigan motorists like the state's more than 1,000 miles of superhighway.

Another factor is the state's "outstanding" winter maintenance program, Mackie said. Despite heavy snowfall in many sections of the state, all state highways were kept clear, he said.

## Names Full-Time Lansing Lobbyist

John G. Semann of Berkeley formerly with this city's board of supervisors, has been named to the newly created \$7,500 post of lobbyist in Lansing for Oakland County.

His appointment was made by Delos Hamlin, County Board of Supervisors, with agreement of the board, upon recommendation of the job by the ways and means committee.

Semann had been serving as a part-time lobbyist for the County. However, a question about the legality of the arrangement under which he received \$15 a day plus travel and lodgings as a supervisor on official business resulted in creation of the full-time post.
