This is one of the baskets into which most of the energy of intellectual interest are being placed this term, and there is little doubt that it will turn out to be a fine incubator for hatching young ideas.

Wilson Talk Is Given by Draper Allen

No person today more closely personifies Woodrow Wilson and his principles than Adlai Stevenson, American ambassador to the United Nations. Draper Allen of 2348 Northlawn, said Thursday at Bethany College.

Allen, a former manufacturer who is now a court commissioner of Michigan, spoke at a convocation at Bethany, W. Va. He discussed the subject, "Woodrow Wilson Fifty Years Ago," in observance of the 50th anniversary of the assumption of the United States presidency by Woodrow Wilson.

Allen, who has been a delegate to national conventions, predicted that historians will rank Wilson as one of the greatest of U.S. Presidents along with Washington, Lincoln, Jefferson, Madison, Theodore Roosevelt and Franklin D. Roosevelt.

HE SAID that three unsuccessful candidates should be included in this galaxy of statesmen: Charles Evans Hughes, Robert A. Taft and Adlai Stevenson, because of the principles which they represented and fought for.

As a young man in school, Allen heard Wilson for the first time. The occasion was an important address by Wilson in Chicago. This marked the beginning of Allen's interest in Wilson and it has continued to this day.

WILSON was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize as the "creator of the league of nations." He was the author of many books, including "Congressional Government," "History of the American People," and "The Life of George Washington." He was offered the presidency of seven American universities.

Congress in further recognition of this great contribution by Wilson has approved a bill signed by President Kennedy authorizing the erection of a memorial to the memory of Wilson in Washington, Allen said.

"To me," Allen said, "this is confirmation of my estimate of Wilson and the place history is giving him among our great presidents."
