His conditions were accepted, and he remains at Faith Lutheran Church.

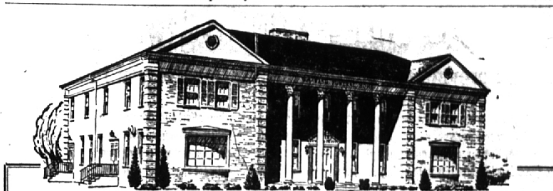
