Teachers Plan Conference on Young Pupils

Dr. William Wattenberg, director, Delinquency Control Center, Wayne State University, will open the spring conference of the Michigan Association for Childhood Education, May 3 and 4 in Midland.

Approximately 600 teachers will hear Dr. Wattenberg speak at 8 p.m. May 3 general session in Chestnut Hill School gymnasium. Dr. Wattenberg, a native New Yorker, received his BS degree from City College of New York and MA and PhD degrees from Columbia University.

Presently, he is education consultant for the Michigan Society for Mental Hygiene. He has worked with the Youth Bureau of the Detroit Police Department on a series of juvenile delinquent studies involving both boys and girls.

A SECOND noted guest will be Dr. Lucille Lindberg, president of the Association for Childhood Education International. Dr. Lindberg

is the noon luncheon speaker May 4.

Her background in education includes a professorship at Queens College, City University of New York. Dr. Lindberg is author of the English and Spanish edition of "The Democratic Classroom." She is co-author of "Teaching Primary Children" and "Exploring Beginnings." Dr. Lindberg also has written sections in three other publications distributed by the elementary school principals.

Dr. Lindberg spent five weeks as a guest of the Soviet Educational Workers' Union studying Soviet education. She has viewed educational systems in six South American countries, in Finland, in England and in nine countries of Africa.

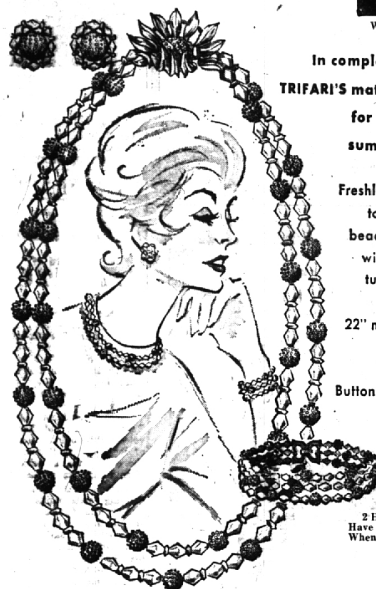

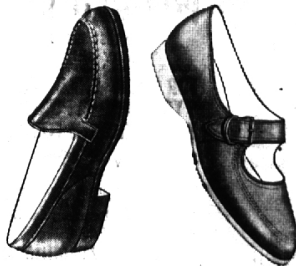

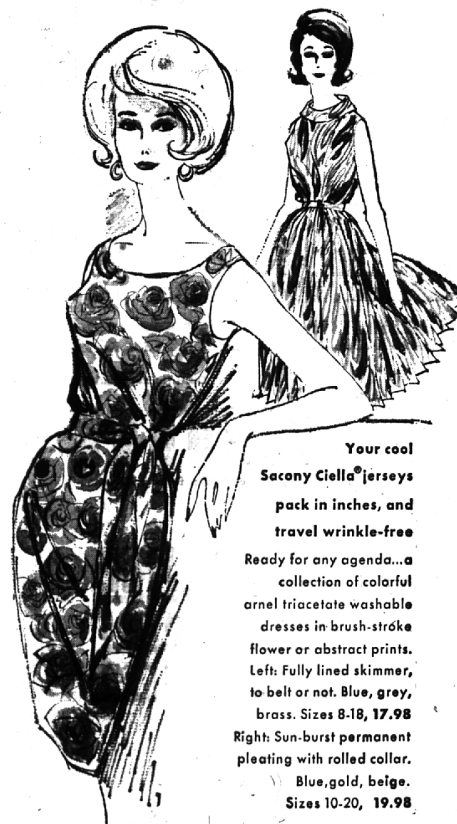
