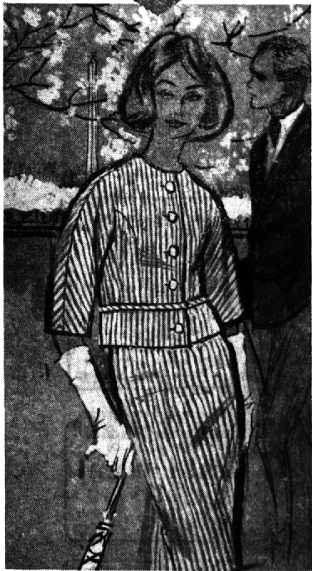

Safety Boys Will Travel On AAA Washington Trip

Two safety boys who were four-day trip will come May 11 when the Michigan delegation joins the Michigan Life-Saving Medal last year will travel to the 7th annual AAA Safety Patrol Rally in Washington, D.C., May 9-12.

Good belt for trap shot

When executing a trap shot, try to hit the sand with the back of the club head. This permits flange of the wedge to slide through the sand rather than dig into it. Backspin is inevitable in this manner.

Since you strike the sand at least two inches behind the ball, swing with a good deal more force than normal. A trap shot of 40 feet has to be swung at as hard as a pitch of 40 yards.

To maintain a firm stance, wiggle your feet into the sand.

All trap shots should be played with the same basic action.

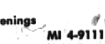
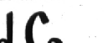
