Sunset over San Francisco:
"A fiery afterglow lasted hours after the sun seemed to have expired. The cloud formations were miraculous. Clouds were an all-over blue-gray tone . . . we had the thrilling experience of feeling as though we were surrounded by a sea of blue baroque pearls, with the same kind of shimmer found only in the most lustrous ones."

Colorful dress of the stewards:
"Our flight to Honolulu was as restful as if we were on our own private plane, with an occasional pleasant and helpful interruption from a kimono-clad stewardess, whose garb was embroidered with vari-colored chrysanthemums.
