Three-Level Bank to Be Built in Troy

Troy National bank president Edward A. Rusin has announced construction of a three-level building at the present site at Maple Road and Livernois Road in Troy will begin Wednesday. Total cost of the building and site will be in excess of \$225,000, with the architectural design by Clifford Wright & Associates of Detroit and general contracting by Kitchen Building Co. of Detroit. The building will comprise

approximately 5,000 square feet of floor space with drive-in facilities, and banking hours will include all-day Saturday. A unique feature of the building will be a lower-level community room complete with kitchen facilities to be provided free for use by various civic, service and church organizations.

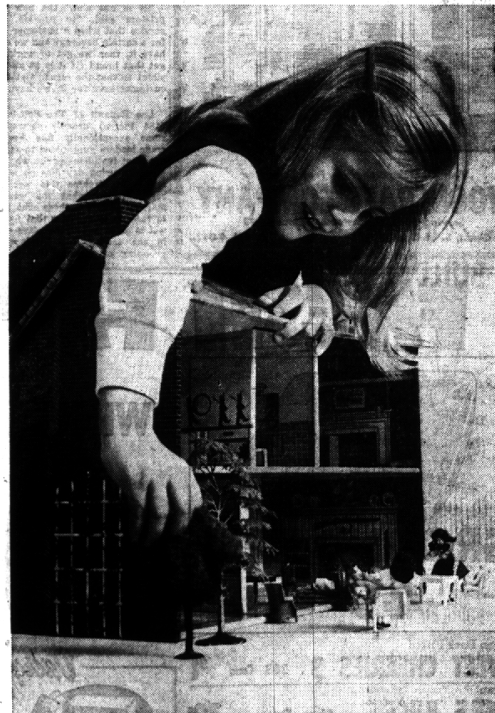
