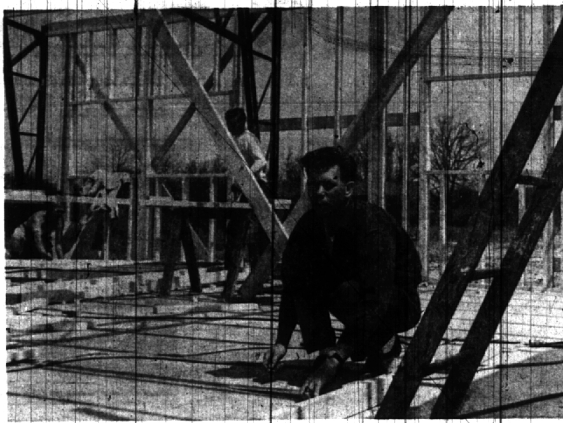

**Franklin Eyes  
Smaller Tax  
For Roads**

FRANKLIN—There is every indication that Franklin will paper off its five-year road millage program with a smaller tax this summer.

After assessing property owners the full eight mills allowed by a vote in 1958, the council expects that between revenues based on an assessed real property valuation of about \$7,817,399 and a fund balance, the road construction program can be financed with a levy of six mills this year.

A board of review is scheduled for May 18.

Gov. George Romney has appointed William B. Grabendike, 1587 Yorkshire Road, Birmingham, to the newly expanded seven-member State Board of Equalization.

Grabendike, a professional real estate appraiser, was retired last month in advance of his scheduled retirement as director of the Oakland County Equalization Department. He has been working out of his home as a special consultant for the department.

IN ACCEPTING the appointment, Grabendike announced, "It is especially gratifying to me since it appears that several high officials in both local and county government have given their personal endorsement in my favor, due to my past 10-year record and experience as a professional appraiser and director of the Oakland County Equalization Department."

Grabendike's previous experience included licensed real estate broker since 1924, supervising appraiser of Detroit City Housing Commission, senior FHA appraiser, chief appraiser federal VA loan guaranty program for the State of Michigan, vice president and chief appraiser First Mortgage Corp. and director Oakland County Appraisal and Equalization for the last 10 years.

REDUCTIONS ARE indicated for the village green contract, \$3,385; office expense, \$650; publicity, \$300; legal, \$800; and health, \$300.

Remaining the same as this year will be elections, \$500; rubbish collection, \$2,400; fire department, \$600; cemetery, \$400; library, \$250; and miscellaneous, \$200.

THE ROAD budget, with an expected \$25,000 from state tax distribution and \$40,000 from the 6 mills for road construction, should run around \$71,900 for revenues.

However, \$91,100 is budgeted so the difference will be taken from a \$35,209 fund balance in the road budget.

A public hearing will be held in the village offices on May 13 at 8 p.m., preceding the monthly council meeting.
