WHAT DO YOU DO NOW?

- Mighty glad you asked that question because it indicates you are serious. "What do you do now?" depends on what you REALLY want to accomplish.
1. CLOVER MITES: This tree (+); feed on foliage only; invade houses & lay eggs; adults in house. Outside, remove all grass within 18" of the house. Fill area with gravel or flowers; Spray 3 to 5' strip around house with ISOTOX. Repeat every 5 to 7 days until under control.
2. CRABGRASS: If you don't like it cover the infested areas with DOW'S ZYRON as AGRICO'S PRE-EMERGE. If you have not fertilized your lawn AdeQUATELY for the crabgrass control.
3. BROADLEAF WEEDS:—Three things are required—warmer temperatures and vigorously growing weeds and grass. If such is the case, you will be able to get results for:
-DANDELION, PLANTAIN, THISTLES, BURDOCK—2, 4-D, or 2, 4-D plus 2, 4, 5-T.
-CHICORY, WILD CARROT, GROUND IVY—2, 4-D, plus 2, 4, 5-T.
-BLACK MEDIC, CLOVER, KNOTWEED—ENDOTHAL or SILVEX.
4. BORERS IN ORNAMENTAL TREES: Almost all of these people emerge about the same time—Birch, Ash, Dogwood, etc. (A VIGOROUS TREE IS THE BEST DEFENSE); but since you don't prune well or fertilize well they are not vigorous. SO—SPRAY the trunk and main branches with DIELDRIN (2 teaspoonfuls to 1 gal. of water of 18.5% emulsion). Soak ground.
5. ROSE CHAFERS: The drive will be on very soon. A two-step program is recommended:
1. Kill grubs in soil:
2. Lbs. of 10% CHLORDANE POWDER to 1,000 Sq. Ft.
1 1/2 Oz. of DIELDRIN to 1,000 Sq. Ft.
2. Kill the Rose Chafers:—
ISOTOX or DDT mixed with MALATHION (2 Tablespoonful of 50% wettable DDT plus 2 teaspoonfuls of 50% MALATHION (Per gal. of water, of course).
6. CEDAR APPLE RUST—To make it clear, this causes discoloration & yellowing of the leaves of hawthornes, flowering crabs, etc. The trouble begins in the cedars (arbutifolia), goes through the other trees for 5 months and then back to the cedars for about 15 months.
If you cannot eliminate all cedars within a quarter of a mile from your property here is your program:—
1. Cut out all the orange-colored jelly masses in yours and your neighbors cedars.
2. Spray your plants with CAPTAN (a fungicide):
a. As the buds show pink
b. When in full bloom
c. When the petals fall
d. 7 days after petal fall
e. 7 days after "d."
7. BIRCHLEAF MINER:—These dastardly bugs live BETWEEN the upper and lower surfaces of the leaves—can operate between the 1st of May and mid-June, and late July (second brood).
WHEN THE FIRST MINERS appear in the leaves spray with ISOTOX or MALATHION—repeat twice more at 10-day intervals. (To control the second brood spray in mid-July and again 10 days later).
8. THOSE HORRIBLE ROUND GROSS GRASS CLUMPS that appear here and there in your lawn.
Spray with SPOT GRASS KILLER.
9. TO CONTROL (OR ELIMINATE) BENTGRASS in a Merion Blue Grass lawn:—SPRAY MAY 16th, July 15th, and SEPT. 15th.
Use 2 1/2 TABLESPOONS of McCLELLAN-BALL WEED KILLER or ORTHOS WEED-BAGON, PLUS TABLESPOON ENDOTHAL to 1 gal. water to 100 sq. ft.
10. By the time you read this spring will be here (a week or two later, SUMMER might show up).
Your PATIO or TERRACE or GARDEN may need a STATUE, a FOUNTAIN, a BIRD BATH, some PATIO BLOCKS, some iron PLANT HANGERS, some—oh, heck, come on in and SEE for yourself the things we have for your home.

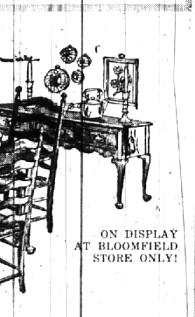
