the Ancient Mariners will take place after the dinner-hour, followed by a discussion of special interests and hobbies.

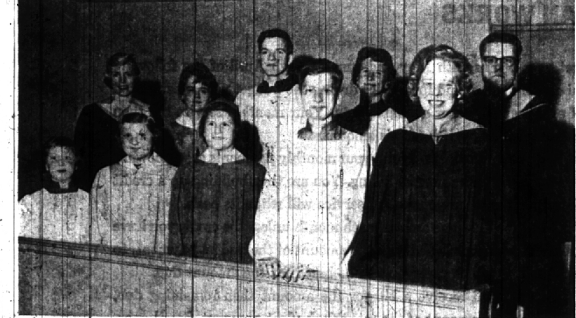
