City and Country School of Bloomfield Hills is conducting an institute for kindergarten and nursery school on the theme "Extending the World of the Fresh Child," Saturday.

The school is an independent one accepting only children who qualify as being gifted. There are, however, no such requirements for the nursery school children.

During the last five years the school has endeavored to include in its nursery school program new aspects of learning designed to further familiarize the young child with the world he is destined to live in and to begin to equip him with skills.

THE WORKSHOPS will be conducted by staff members who will try to show methods to carry out such a program without violating the basic principle of nursery school education which includes thoughtful planning for the needs of the individual.

The institute will be opened by a panel discussion on "The Importance of Supporting Initial Intellectual Development." The panel members will be Dr. W. Fowler, research associate, Merrill Palmer School; Bert Pryor, director, James Couzens Nursery School; and George Roeder, headmaster of City and Country School.

The institute has created a great deal of interest among kindergarten and nursery school teachers. Registration had to be closed because the limit of 250 participants has been reached.

THE FOLLOWING week, Sat. May 11, at 9 p.m., the parent group of City and Country School will sponsor an evening of entertainment at Ford Auditorium. This will be a show headlined by comedian Alan King.

In this effort to raise funds for scholarships, the parents are supporting the ideology of the school—that giftedness is found in children of all races and backgrounds, and that unable to afford tuition are just as important as those who are more financially fortunate.
