Paintings, such exertile, confronting, flamboyant, colorful, serene, steadfast or depressing controversale even dull, Paintings, sup things about people. They state the artist's feelings and ideas about his subject (or lack off one). They say what sert of thing the owner feels is significant.

A painting worth having, like a friend worth having, depends on how warmly your respond to each other.

BS SURE to pick a painting you really like, it sounds silly to say something so obvious, but many an hospitable homeowner wants EVERYONE to like the painting and

offend no one. This is as impossible as maintaining a completely neutral point of view about politics. (If you aren't for you must be against).

Some subjects and styles do have more general appeal
than others, Flowers, landscapes, children and sea scapes
are usually safe, apoular choices. But if the painting is
too conservative it will lack any distinction and interest.
Since you will see the painting more than anyone who
visits, get one that means something to XOU.

HAVE YOU happened to visit a home beautifully done in a handsome decorator scheme and yet feel that something is missing? Usually that something is a personal thing that identifies the owner's individuality. Paintings make a strong personal statement. Artists aim for more than a patch of color on your wall.

Don't feel hampered in your choice by Your color
scheme. Starting out to search for a painting that is a
particular size with specific colors to match the drapes
and go over the sofa is like chossing a friend of a specific
size and shape to fit a low chair you happen to own.

Nearly everyone has a fairly well developed set of color
preferences. Any painting you choose is likely to go well
in a home with colors you've chosen. (And if the colors
