NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF BIRMINGHAM CITY CODE

Pursuant to Section 3, Chapter V of the Charter of the City of Birmingham, notice is hereby given that the Birmingham City Code adopted by the Birmingham City Commission on January 21, 1963, has been printed, and that printed copies thereof are available at the Office of the City Clerk for public inspection and for distribution to the public at a charge of \$3.00 per copy.

The Birmingham City Code contains all ordinances of the City of Birmingham, notice is hereby given that the printing and availability of said Code, and this notice thereof, constitutes publication of the Code. No further publication is required for the effectiveness of said Code and none is contemplated.

The effective date of the Birmingham City Code is May 1, 1963.

NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF CERTAIN DOCUMENTS BY REFERENCE

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 3(k) of Act 279 of 1909, State of Michigan, as amended, the following listed documents are adopted by the City of Birmingham as part of the Birmingham City Code, as therein modified.

- The Abridged Building Code, 1960 Edition, and the Basic Building Code, 1960 Edition, to the extent that the Basic Building Code supplements the Abridged Building Code, both as promulgated and published by the Building Official Conference of America, Inc., for the purpose of regulating the erection, construction, enlargement, equipment, alteration, repair, moving, removal, demolition, conversion, use, height, area and maintenance of all buildings and structures in the City of Birmingham. Complete printed copies of the Basic Building Code are available for public use and inspection at the office of the City Clerk.
- The Detroit Plumbing Code prepared and promulgated by the Industry Committee and representatives of the Department of Buildings and Safety Engineering of the City of Detroit, an association organized and conducted for the purpose of preparing said code, adopted by the City of Detroit August 21, 1956 and published by the Department of Buildings and Safety Engineering of the City of Detroit for the purpose of governing the requirements for the design and installation of plumbing systems, including sanitary and storm drainage, sanitary facilities, water supplies and storm water and sewage disposal in buildings in the City of Birmingham. Complete printed copies of the Detroit Plumbing Code, herein adopted, are available for public use and inspection at the Office of the City Clerk.
- The National Electrical Code, 1959 Edition, as promulgated and published by the National Board of Fire Underwriters, approved August 5, 1959, American Standards Association, for the purpose of regulating the installation, alteration, repair, conversion, use and maintenance of all new electric wiring for light, heat and power service equipment, for radio and television receiving systems, and all alterations or extensions to existing wiring systems in buildings and structures, in the City of Birmingham.
- The National Fire Prevention Code, 1960 Edition, as promulgated by the National Board of Fire Underwriters, New York City, New York, for the purpose of safeguarding life and property from the hazards of fire and explosion arising from the storage, handling and use of hazardous substances, materials and devices and from conditions hazardous to life or property in the use of occupancy of buildings or premises.

Complete printed copies of each of the said documents so adopted by reference are available for public use and inspection at the Office of the City Clerk.

ADOPTION OF UNIFORM TRAFFIC CODE

The Uniform Traffic Code for Cities, Townships and Villages promulgated by the Commissioner of State Police on February 14, 1958 and published in Supplement No. 13, together with the amendments thereto promulgated February 14, 1961, and published in Supplement No. 25, Michigan Administrative Code is adopted by reference by the City of Birmingham pursuant to Public Act 62 of 1956, State of Michigan as part of the Birmingham City Code. The purpose of the Uniform Traffic Code is to regulate the operation of vehicles, to provide for the regulation and use of streets, highways and alleys and other public and semi-public places within the City of Birmingham and to provide penalties for the violation of said Code.

Complete copies of the Uniform Traffic Code are available at the Office of the City Clerk for inspection by and distribution to the public at all times.

Area Resident Is Elected to Kresge Board

Election of William H. Baldwin, 729 Lone Pine Road, Bloomfield Hills, to the Board of Trustees of The Kresge Foundation, effective May 1, was announced by Stanley S. Kresge, president.
