Community College May Be on Ballot

Governor George Romney was expected to sign a bill Wednesday permitting Oakland County to vote on the establishment of a community college. He must sign the bill by Saturday in order for it to become law.

His signature was needed to place the issue on the June 10 ballot.

Necessary steps prior to its being put on the ballot are approval of the ballot propositions by the County Board of Education (which had a special meeting scheduled for 4 p.m. Wednesday), approval by the state superintendent of public instruction and notification of local school boards of the actual ballot proposals.

(The Birmingham Board of Education also had a meeting scheduled for 4 p.m. Wednesday to make needed arrangements here.)

CANDIDATES FOR a six-member board of trustees, which would run the new junior college, must file nominating petitions by Saturday with the County Board of Education.

Issues on the June 10 ballot concerning the college would be:

- To establish a community college district.
- To support it with a one-mill tax.
- To elect the six-member board of trustees as the governing body of the community college district.

COMPLICATIONS ON the signing of the bill by Gov. Romney arose from a pile-up of bills passed by the legislature that had to be printed before they could be presented for the governor's signature, which must be affixed by Saturday to make them into law.

The bill was proofread and returned to the printers on Monday night.

area on the second floor. Each of the 47 fitting rooms is equipped with a chair and a large mirror.

A battery of 14 phones in the fitting room area connect directly to the alteration rooms where operators can sit at work tables and talk to salespeople without interrupting their work.

THE "DESIGNERS' Room" is a major feature of the new addition. It will be used primarily for the leisure type of shopping, according to Mason.

Along with the main "Designers Room" four smaller private rooms also have been installed.

Mason said they have already proven themselves so popular the company is "thinking of putting in more."

The large dressing rooms feature silk screen walls and indirect lighting.

Much of the wallpaper throughout the store has been imported from Italy and features a metal finish. The decorations and crests on the walls have all been installed by hand.

ANOTHER SPECIAL feature on the second floor is the "Seasonal Shop." The department can be converted from a bathing suit display area into a ski area within a matter of hours.

The overall architectural appearance of the expanded facilities is consistent with the contemporary design of the other Jacobson buildings.

General contractor for the project was Cunningham-Limp of Detroit. The architect was Arthur C. A. Schmidt and Associates.
