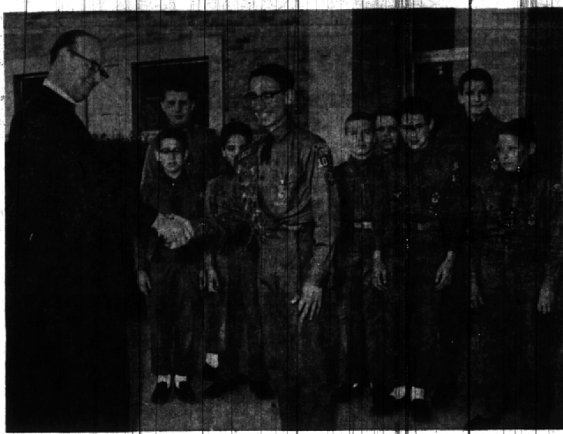

FRUITFUL TIPS

APPLES:—AFTER petal-fall spray regularly with McCLELLAN-BALL FRUIT TREE spray or ACME's spray.

CHERRIES:—If you see oozing injuries on large limbs, or trunks, cut out injured or dead bark, and paint with TREE WOUND PAINT.

GRAPES:—NO NOT SPRAY until shoots are 1" to 2" long. Repeat when shoots are 4" to 6" long and again WHEN FIRST BLOSSOMS OPEN. Use McCLELLAN-BALL or ACME COMBINATION FRUIT TREE SPRAY.

PINES (mugo, scotch and red): If new shoots suddenly with the PINE SHOOT MOTH has STRUCK, SPRAY IMMEDIATELY DD-IJT and MALATHION. Concentrate on the tips.
