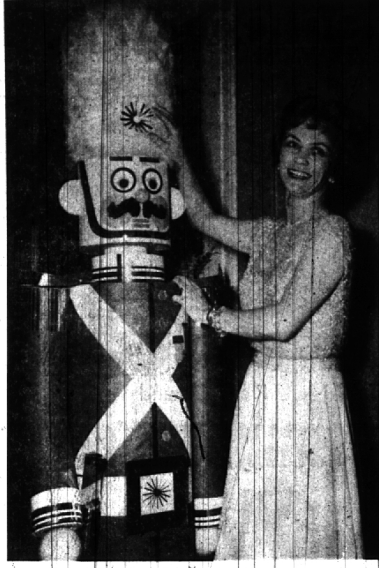


# Oakland Hills Welcomes Spring, New Members

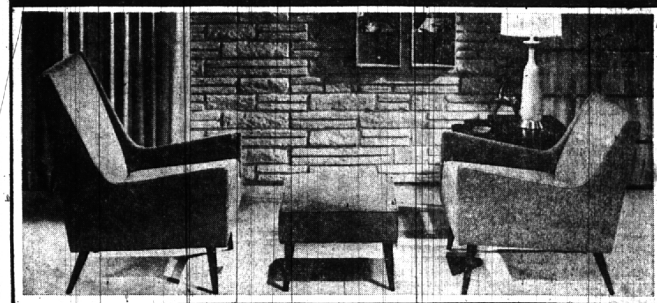
