

Tulip Festival Train Scheduled to Run Via Birmingham

The Michigan Railroad Club's "Holland Holiday" special train, scheduled to run Saturday, will travel via Birmingham and other cities. More than 1,000 persons will be on board when the 25-car Grand Trunk Western "passenger express" heads across Michigan for Grand Rapids where chartered sightseeing buses will take over.

Ticket sales were halted when inability to secure adequate coaches and buses made it impossible for the club to accommodate more passengers.

The run will leave the Beach Street station in Detroit at 8:30 a.m. and arrive back at 10 p.m.

DISTRICT THREE includes the cities of Birmingham, Bloomfield Hills, Kewego Harbor, Troy, Walled Lake, Wilson and Milford. Also included in the district are the townships of Avon, Bloomfield, Commerce, Milford and West Bloomfield.

State Sen. Farrell E. Roberts and Rep. Henry M. Hogan, Jr., are expected to attend the unofficial caucus.

The report also pointed out ways in which the Birmingham Planning Board could contribute to improving the aesthetic and environmental aspect of the community's life.

THE FIRST utility covered in the report was Birmingham's water system. It was generally found that the city's water service is adequate.

The only part of Birmingham where service could be improved is the northern part of the city—the Woodward-Quarton area.

Basic considerations of a water system are the quantity and quality of water that is available as well as the pressure at which the supply can be delivered.

area of the city is considered to be in need of some type of sewer improvement. The report stressed the need should not be taken to mean the area (generally the southern part of Birmingham) lacks sewers but they do not have a flow-carrying capacity equivalent to that of the remainder of the city.

THE REMAINING utilities in Birmingham, such as gas, electric and telephone, are provided by private companies. The companies, the report notes, are generally prompt in expanding their services as a community grows.

These companies should be urged to cooperate and make joint use of facilities whenever possible. The report said this is to help improve the aesthetic environment of the community.

YOUR GARDEN CENTER

WHAT DO YOU EXPECT FOR NOTHING?

1. A SATISFACTORY LAWN?
2. PLENTY OF BLOOMS on flowering trees?
3. A VEGETABLE GARDEN with good production?
4. A DRIVEWAY free of weeds?
5. FRUIT TREES with worm-free fruit?

It requires a bit of thought and action, and this is what this expensive writing (\$1.90 an inch is about).

1. A LAWN is produced by:
 - (a) Adding 6 lbs. of nitrogen to 1,000 sq. ft. each year. This is accomplished by applying a 10-6-4 fertilizer at 20 lbs. to 1,000 sq. ft. (A 20-10-5 would cover twice as much area.)
 - (b) The grass should NOT BE CUT LESS THAN 2 INCHES HIGH BECAUSE the cut blade is the ONLY part of the plant that can CONVERT THE FERTILIZER INTO A USEFUL FOOD. If your mowing company won't do this tell them to "go to" and get one that will raise the mower.
 - (c) Water your lawn not more than once a week—BUT PUT on 1 INCH of water each time. (This does NOT apply to bent grass.)
2. Flowering trees require fertilizer just as much as a rosebush or a petunia plant does. These trees, however, usually require a lot MORE PHOSPHATE (0-20-0 NOW or BONE MEAL in the fall).
3. FLOWER & VEGETABLE gardens will not give results (we mean GOOD results) unless they are fed twice with 4-12-4 or 5-10-5, or some other typical material. Do it NOW and again in JUNE.
- DRICONURE is an excellent starter and conditioner but does not have enough muscle to carry through the season.
4. Driveway and patio or terrace weeds can be obliterated for one year with one application of HAMDON'S WEED KILLER or ORTHO'S TRIOX or GREENFIELD'S COMPLETE KILL. READ THE INSTRUCTIONS.

CANDLE LIGHTS for the patio—in the shape of Tulips, Dahlias, and Roses.

City commissioners have met in regular session since before the April 1 election.

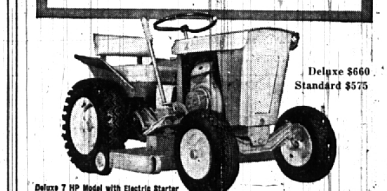
