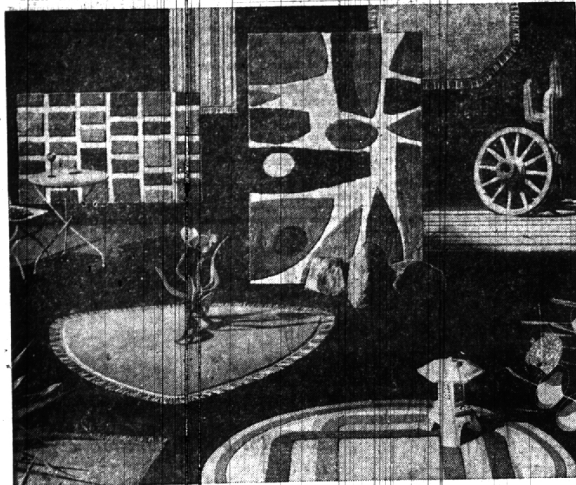

construction started within 90 days," he stated. The project must first get approval of the Oakland Board of Supervisors and the Michigan Municipal Finance Commission. Under terms of the grant, the

township has 120 days to get the proposed construction under way after receipt of the grant. THE SEWER will serve 300 homes, several hundred vacant lots and the Sylvan Shopping Center. Residents will pay a \$550 tap-in fee to look into the lateral. The fee may be financed over a 10-year period.

The regulation \$250 tap-in fee to the Farmington interceptor also will be charged. Commercial establishments will pay similar, per-unit charges. On vacant property, according to Rehard, owners will have to pay both of the tap-in charges before a building permit will be issued by the township.
