Kingswood had two scholarship winners. Julie Graham won a National Merit Scholarship award, and Brenda Ballman won a Dow Chemical Award.

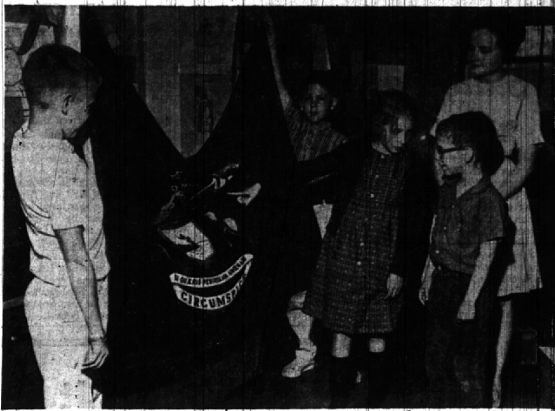
