

School Board Arranges Education Open House

The faculty of the Oakland County Board of Education will offer school patrons a glimpse of the county's educational progress at an Education Day of Michigan Week and some of the ways instruction and curriculum are being strengthened in the public schools of the county.

Dr. William Emerson, county superintendent, said visitors are invited to an open house today at the Board of Education Office, Campus Drive, in the County Service Center, which is on U.S. 10 west of Pontiac.

Demonstrations, seminars, and exhibits have been planned from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.

THE ROLE of the county in the education of handicapped children will be demonstrated on two closed-circuit television presentations. Mrs. Donna Nowland, instructor of the deaf, will give a regular lesson to a two-year-old pupil before the television cameras.

Dr. Leon Hall, coordinator of psychological services, will comment on a psychological examination to be presented on the closed circuit channel.

A guided tour through Dr. Julian Green's collection of Michigan geological specimens, including jade, has been scheduled from 11 a.m. to noon.

Unincorporated Areas Dissolved by Township

BLOOMFIELD TOWNSHIP — The lawsuit by the two township boards against the Detroit Bank is based on location of the bank of the Commonwealth's branch in a banking district allowed by the present township board last week.

The original action in 1956 was taken at the request of the state banking commission in order to set up exclusive banking districts within various areas in the township.

The board's action in eliminating the existence of the three districts—known as the unincorporated Village of Miracle Mile, Bloomfield and Bloomfield Village—came after a recent ruling by the state attorney general that neither a township board nor the state banking commission had jurisdiction to determine the boundaries of an unincorporated village.

TOWNSHIP Attorney Tom Dillon told the board that its action would not affect a lawsuit presently underway in which the Pontiac State Bank and the Community National Bank of Pontiac seek a permanent injunction against the Bank of the Commonwealth's operation of a branch bank at Woodward and Square Lake roads. He said, however, that it could eliminate future complications in the determination of banking districts in the township.
