**LWW Re-elects
Local Woman
As President**

Mrs. Thomas Snellham of Lakewood Park, Birmingham, was elected to an unprecedented second term as president of the League of Women Voters of Michigan at the biennial convention in Ann Arbor last week.

Mrs. Snellham, who was president of the League during the intensive campaign for the new constitution, will serve the organization for the next two years. Delegates adopted a two-year study of public welfare as the state program and Mrs. George Hilfinger, immediate past president of the LWW of Birmingham, was appointed to the state board of directors as study chairman.

Mrs. Hilfinger said the 35 Michigan leagues will work toward an emerging consensus which should enable them to act on welfare legislation during the second year of the study.

The convention voted to retain the LWW platform on constitutional revision throughout the period of implementation of the new constitution. In addition to its cooperation with the other leagues in the state on the welfare program, the Birmingham league will be working with the Oakland County Council of eight LWW's on the study of Oakland County Government.
