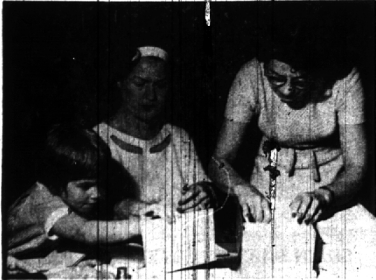


# Carousel Ball Invitations Go into the Mail

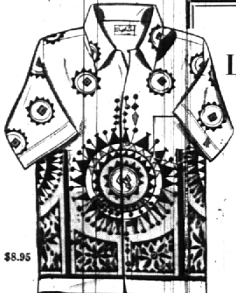

## WESTCHESTER

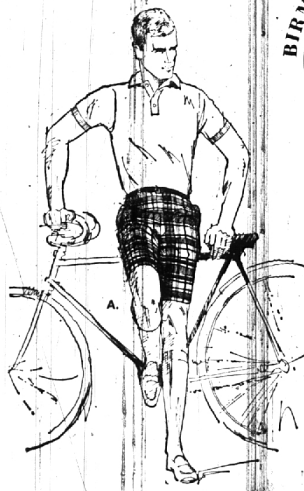
