Set High School Summer Session At Seaholm

The Birmingham schools will offer a program of summer courses for high school credit this year for those students who need or wish to repeat work, and for those who wish and are qualified to take advanced credits. In addition, several noncredit courses are being offered at both the junior and senior high levels. The secondary summer school is open to residents and nonresidents in grades seven through twelve.

The location of the summer school will be at the Seaholm High School, 2436 West Lincoln, Birmingham. Classes will be in session from June 18 to August 9. One unit of credit will be offered for four-hour courses; one-half unit, for two-hour courses. White students will meet from 8 to 12 a.m. daily. It is possible a few afternoon classes will be required if registration warrants.
