Many of the experts in bridge have at times been hurt by the "phantom save" and it is always an interesting subject. The newer players are hurt more often and then again are hurt for their failure to make a save. It resolves itself into the expression, "To save or not to save?"

In a special master point game at the Oakland Hills Country Club, Betty Cooper and Betty Angle found the problem of a "save" confronting them and today's hand is the answer as to how to handle it.

Betty Angle perfectly passed the seven heart bid and let it go to her partner to either double or take the save. Betty Cooper knew her ace of spades was not a winner, nor was her queen of hearts, but what about her king of clubs?
The hand would be definitely a distribution affair, so she had one chance in two that the other long suit of East and West was clubs and the safer bid would be the seven spades. She would beat all six heart bids and had an even chance to beat seven hearts.
The play of the hand was routine and the "Betty's" were down two tricks for three hundred points, compared to seven hearts for 225 points or even six hearts for 140 points.

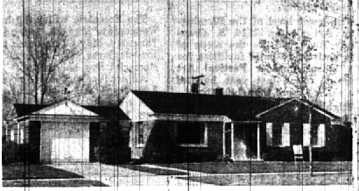
Foreign Student Panel Scheduled For AAUN Meeting
