Representing a total net tax increase of \$33,824.06 over last year, the city commission Monday unanimously approved a 1948-49 fiscal year. Of the total amount, the general tax levy would obtain \$419,645.06, while the remaining \$195,930 would come from non-tax revenue.

The Community House Roll Call fund is getting close to the minimum amount of \$28,558 needed for 1948-49 budgeted operating expenses and a picked score of workers is making a special effort to close the books of the fund drive by May 11 with the full sum collected or pledged. "We have \$25,000 in sight, I believe, and \$28,500 in hand," Charles E. Kass, Roll Call chairman, said Tuesday.
