Executives Address GM Stockholders

Sales of 7,000,000 cars a year have become "the normal yardstick for current annual passenger car needs" in the United States, Chairman Frederic G. Donner of General Motors said Friday.

Donner and President John F. Gordon, both of Bloomfield Hills, speaking at the 55th annual meeting of General Motors shareholders, expressed confidence in prospects for continued growth of the automotive industry.

"There is, I believe, every reasonable prospect that our industry will have customers in rising numbers over the long term—for our products," Donner told approximately 4,000 shareholders in the Buick-Oldsmobile-Pontiac Assembly Division plant near Wilmington, Del. "The opportunity for continued growth is evident both at home and overseas."

GORDON REPORTED that following record GM sales and earnings in the first quarter of this year, total deliveries of GM passenger cars during April and the first 20 days of May totaled 620,000 units, compared with deliveries totaling 622,000 units in the same period last year.

GM's truck sales so far this year have totaled more than 600,000 units, up 10 per cent from the corresponding portion of 1962.

Explaining why he did not regard the registration of "the past million new cars in the United States during 1962 as abnormal, Donner reviewed some statistics.

"In 1957 just under six million new cars were registered," he said. "This represented 12.4 per cent of the passenger cars in use at the beginning of that year. In 1960 6.6 million new cars were registered—but this represented only about 12.2 per cent of all cars in use. The seven million new cars registered in 1962 in turn represented 12.1 per cent of all cars in use on January 1, 1962.

"Each of these years was one of good business and looked at in this way it is clear that the sales of the industry in 1962, far from being unusual, were about in line with earlier years when considered in relation to total cars in use."

PRESIDENT of the award-winning Extendo Co. was Dan Wickham, 18, son of Mr. and Mrs. Frank E. Wickham of 6645 Meadowlake. The company, counseled in the business field by Cadillac Motor Car Division of GM, was in competition with 369 other JA companies.
