Services will be at the William Yau F. Funeral Home, 4375 N. Woodward, at 2 p.m. Friday. Interment will be in White Chapel Cemetery.

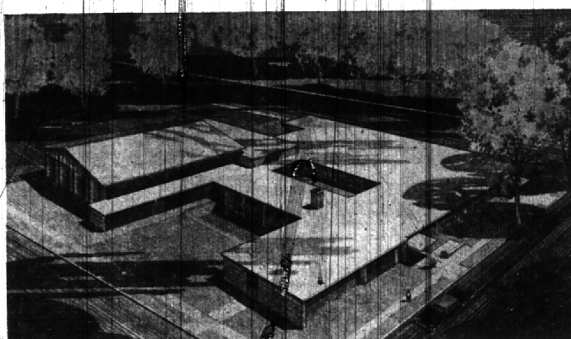
