Hears Report On Activities

Village Women's Club members attending the annual meeting yesterday heard reports on the numerous club activities which have taken place during the first year of residence at the new clubhouse on E. Long Lake Road, Bloomfield Hills. Of particular interest were those on philanthropy, social service and education. Mrs. Howard J. Liverance, chairman of contributions, reported that contributions, have been made during the year to the following 16 community organizations:

Royal Oak Township Recreational Center, Oakland YWCA, Arts Festival, Rehabilitation Center, Pontiac St. Hospital, Birmingham Community House, Tyler School summer program for physically handicapped children, Oakland University Scholarship Fund, League for the Handicapped, Family Service, City and Country School, Boys Republic, Baldwin Library, Operations Crossroad Africa, St. Joseph's Hospital and the Area Service Association.

THE DONATION to Operations Crossroad Africa will go to Nancy Tregeant of Bloomfield Hills. Participants in this program must receive a portion of their financing from community organizations and are asked to report to them on their return. The work of the Social Service Committee under the chairmanship of Mrs. Sylvester Terthall was closely allied with that of the Contributions Committee. Member gave service as well as funds to some of these agencies.

In a special project with World Medical Relief more than 200 doctors, dentists and hospitals were contacted for surplus drugs, instruments and furnishings for use in clinics abroad. Junior members also participated in this service project. Mrs. Norman Ellis, program chairman, reported a new high in educational and cultural activities. There were 28 classes and four special events, all of which were open to the public. She pointed out that the clubhouse is already bursting its seams so that arrangements for augmenting classroom space is being planned.

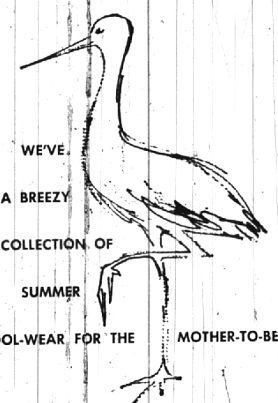

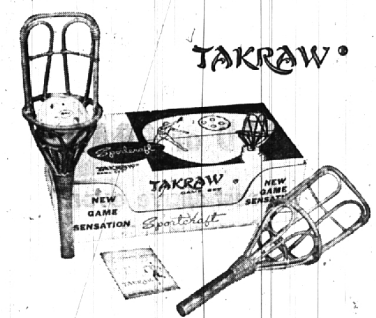

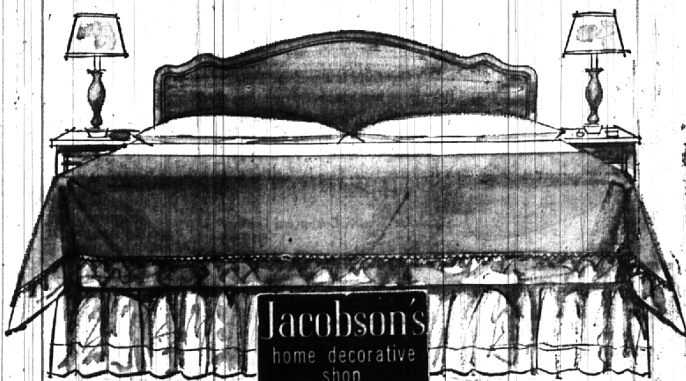
