They will also spend a few days in Toledo and on their return home will stop in Wisconsin, the former home of Mrs. Struble.

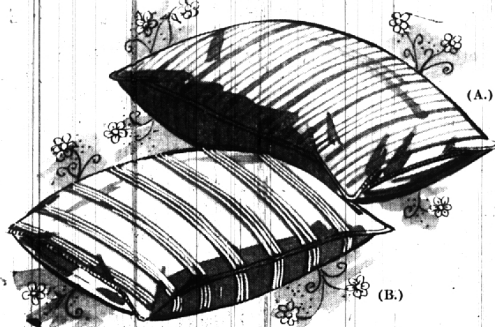
