

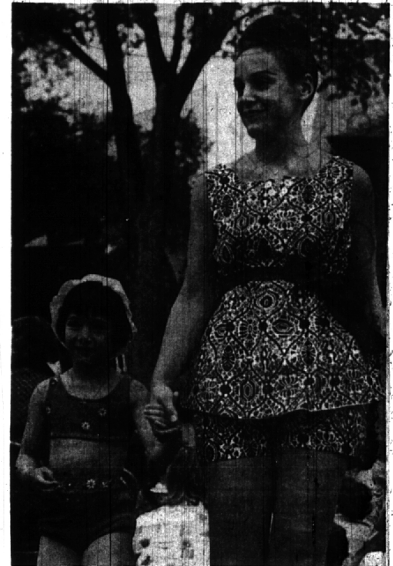
Thousands Jam Shain Park for Fashion Show
