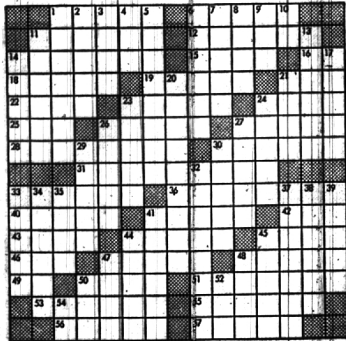

Preparing for the world's largest piano concert, 18 local piano students are among some 900 in the Detroit area meeting in weekly rehearsals for the 20th Michigan Annual Music Festival.

The recital will be presented in Cobo Arena in the Detroit Civic Center at 2:30 p.m. Sunday under auspices of the Festival Teachers Association. The performance will use 200 massed pianos, 25 grand pianos and 25 Hammond electric organs, all furnished by Grinnell Brothers.
