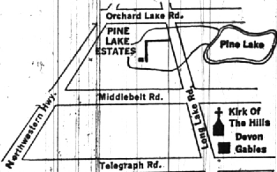

We are proud to announce that the Inter-City Team of four events of Southern Michigan Bridge Association was won by the team captained by George Alderton II of Birmingham. They won their section and played a match with a team from Port Huron and other from Flint for the overall championship; they were the easy winners.

One of the other members of George's team is Roman Zech, who is often George's partner in Birmingham Duplicate games. Today's hand is an interesting hand from this match and his unusual handling of the bidding brought out a win for his team.

We admit it is unusual for one to over-call one no trump with a singleton spade and six hearts, but Roman felt the necessity of giving his partner this information of control and strength. The response of two diamonds was a Carter-Sullivan bid, denoting game in the hand.

West's opening lead of the first of clubs was won in the closed hand and a low heart returned. West returned a second club that was won in the closed hand.

When Roman played out all six hearts, West was squeezed and had to reduce to a lone ace of diamonds, which gave the declarer a chance to play a low diamond from his hand and make five no trump. This won the board.

One of the other teams arrived at a four heart contract, making it, and the other team played 10 of three hearts and only made their three.

Architectural Photographer Exhibits Work

Architectural photographs by Baltazar Korab will be exhibited at the third annual Troy Arts Festival June 22 and 23 at Troy High School.

Korab whose studio is at 950 N. Hunter Blvd., Birmingham, was born in Hungary and has lived in Austria, Italy and Sweden. He studied at the Ecole des Beaux-Arts in France where he received a degree in architecture in 1955.

Having worked in the design offices of LeCorbusier and Saarinen, Korab's first outside commission was photographing the Wayne State University campus in 1956. In October, 1962, the magazine Architectural Forum gave Korab top billing as an architectural photographer.

Southfield Artist To Teach, Lecture At Art Center

Fredrik Decker of 21905 Stahelin, Southfield, abstract painter, sculptor and art director—will stage his 18th one man show at the Gallery Gallery opening Sunday. Valled the "Decade of Decker: Paintings and Sculpture, and recent drawings," it will contain six sculpture pieces, eight paintings and 42 drawings.

Decker, who has also been represented in numerous, invitational and group shows including five recent annual "Michigan Artists" exhibitions at the Detroit Institute of Arts will conduct a "Summer Painters Workshop" starting June 19.

In addition, he will provide a lecture series and critique called "A 20th Century Viewpoint of Abstract Painting" starting June 26.

Both will be held in the gallery adjacent to the Artists' Supply Center, Royal Oak.

The "Summer Painters Workshop" will run from 8 to 10 p.m. on June 19, July 3, 17, 31, and Aug. 14. Approximately 17 may enroll.

The lecture course, "A 20th Century viewpoint of Abstract Painting" will run from 8 to 10 p.m. on June 26, July 10 and 24, and Aug. 7 and 21. Approximately 30 students can be accommodated.

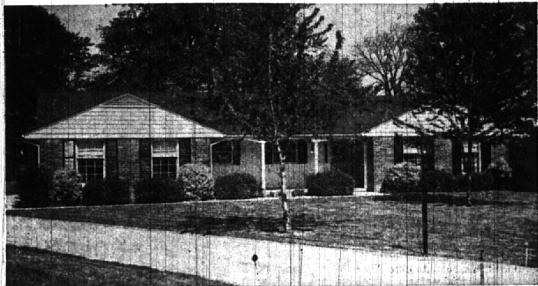

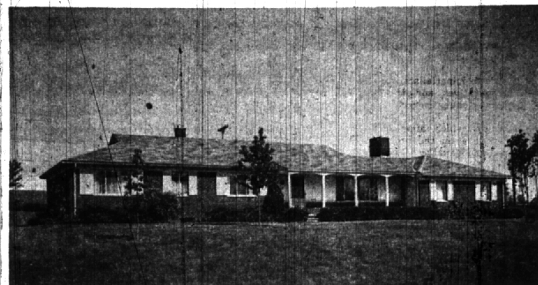

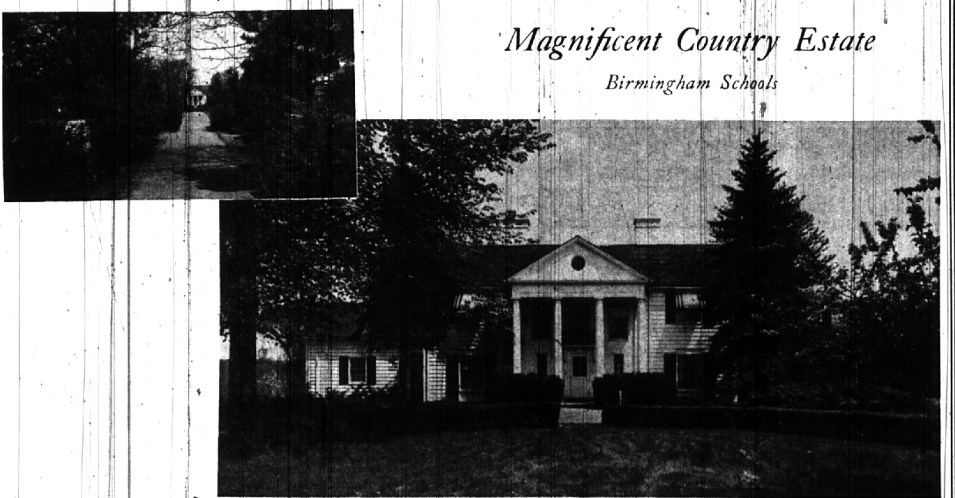
