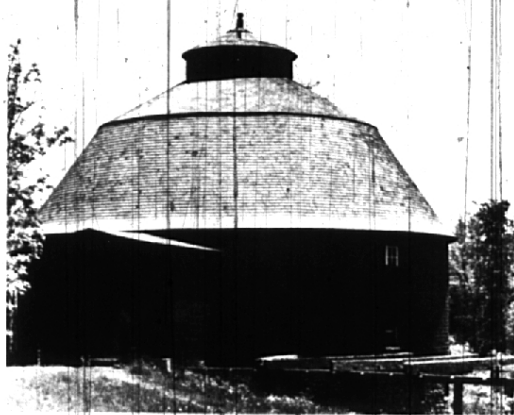


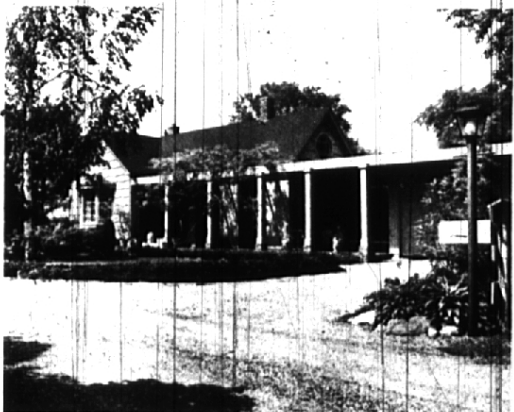
Artists and Architecture Tour Thursday, June 20, 11AM to 5PM

HERE IS WHAT YOU WILL FIND ON THE SIXTH ANNUAL BIRMINGHAM ARTS FESTIVAL'S ARTISTS AND ARCHITECTURE TOUR:

1. Festival exhibition and art market. A former municipal facility, this establishment has been converted into a center of local art activity.
2. Painter's studio residence. A charming home with view of meadow and woods in a setting of collections of arts and crafts.
3. One-hundred-year-old house restored as an elegant bungalow, known for its integration of house and garden. Use of muted, earthy colors with heavy emphasis on evergreen growth suggests the Oriental.
4. Architectural sculptor-muralist, who has been acclaimed for his use of current plastic materials and who now is experimenting with the traditional materials.
5. Studio residence of painter-children's art teacher. Home is enhanced with numerous abstract paintings whose forms are derived from linear sketches suggested from nature.
6. Painter's studio residence. Studio is in attractive, new contemporary home. Artist seeks to express the mood, personality of the individual and prefers to select only those in whom she feels a special interest in painting.
7. Contemporary house of cleft stone and cedar set in woods, this residence reflects owner's desire that art and nature should be an integral part of every day life. House is designed around craft, painting and book collections.
8. Painter's studio residence. Mono-printing will be demonstrated here. Studio looks out on artist's garden and beyond to a natural ravine and stream.
9. Rotunda barn, constructed in 1899, has been converted into a studio for sculptor.
10. Award-winning house. Elegant pavilion-like house, with 13 gables, won top honors from architects in 1960.
11. Demonstrations of graphics and photography and painting, graphics and sculpture in spacious new studio that overlooks a picturesque pond.
