### Twp. Residents To Take Part in National Survey

Residents of Bloomfield Township will be interviewed during the next few weeks as part of a nationwide survey of some 1500 Americans, concerning their opinions on various aspects of modern living. The study is being conducted by the National Opinion Research Center (NORC), located at the University of Chicago.

The survey has two major aspects. Some residents will be asked about their opinions on various subjects. A large part of the questions concern attitudes toward the teaching of reading in schools and adult reading habits. There will also be questions in other areas of current interest.

Other people interviewed will be asked to rate each of 90 different occupations. A grant from the National Science Foundation has been given to NORC to study the prestige of typical occupations. The study is concerned with finding out what social status various occupations have and how and why they have achieved these standings.

Peter H. Rossi, the center's director, explained that the results of the study will be useful in helping to understand the nature of society and planning for the future.

"THE PRESTIGE of an occupation is an important element in its ability to recruit new manpower," Dr. Rossi continued. "It is important for the accuracy of these studies that we get to speak to men and women in all walks of life. We hope that everyone called on will cooperate with our interviewers. All NORC interviewers carry identification cards signed by me. They are trained to keep all conversations completely confidential."

The National Opinion Research Center, a non-profit, non-commercial research agency, has studied many issues since its founding in 1941. The Carnegie Corp., the U. S. Public Health Service, and the U. S. Army are among past sponsors of NORC research in the public interest.

Detroit area teachers will live in Passau-on-the-Rhine, some 100 miles east of Munich in the Bavarian Forest region. They will visit Vienna, as well as take a 10-day trip through Germany, and attend high schools in the area for firsthand acquaintance with German school instruction.

AS GUESTS of the Goethe Institute, they will study German language, literature, art and music. A semi-off luncheon at Wayne State University, MacGregor Memorial Building is scheduled next Thursday for the 15 teachers. Their hosts are the German consul, WSU Dean of Liberal Arts Dr. Lecher and WSU German department head, Dr. Erhard Dabringhaus.
